1. Call to Order/Roll Call

Park Commission Chairman Tom Wolff called the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m.

Present at the meeting were Commissioners Dick Becker, Paul Bernard, Ken Meeks, Heidi Woelfel and Administrative Services Coordinator KateLynn Schmitt.

2. Verification of Compliance with Open Meetings Law

Administrative Services Coordinator Schmitt stated that the agenda was posted at all three local U.S Post Offices, Village Hall and on the Village website. Copies of the agenda were also digitally sent to the *West Bend Daily News*, *Hartford Times Press*, and the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel*.

3. Pledge of Allegiance

4. Meeting Minutes

a. November 11, 2015 – Regular Meeting

Motion by Commissioner Meeks to approve the meeting minutes from the November 11, 2015 Regular Park Commission meeting; Seconded by Commissioner Bernard; Motion passed without objection.

Commissioner Filipiak arrived at 6:05 p.m.

5. DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

a. Discussion regarding upcoming Capital Improvement Park Improvements

Administrative Services Coordinator KateLynn Schmitt gave an update on allocated 2016 money in the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) designated for park projects. The first item Ms. Schmitt talked about was the replacement of the bridge connecting the Historical and Nature Parks.

Ms. Schmitt explained that at the request of the Richfield Historical Society (RHS) \$7,500 had been set aside for the replacement for the bridge. It was the belief of RHS that this would be a sufficient amount of money to complete the project. However, after consulting the Village's Engineer it was determined that the funds would not be sufficient to cover engineering, let alone the replacement of the bridge with flat bottom culverts. Ms. Schmitt stated she has been working with the Richfield Historical Society to explore additional options to water crossings in that area.

Ms. Schmitt also stated another item in the CIP for the parks was a stand-alone piece of playground equipment for Heritage Park. Ms. Schmitt said the Park Commission could reallocate CIP funds to Bark Lake to make trails or other improvements to the park.

The Commissioners discussed the reallocations of funds for Bark Lake Park.

Commissioner Schmitt arrived at 6:10 p.m.

Ms. Schmitt stated that she would explore additional options for the CIP funds to be spent in 2016.

b. Discussion/Action regarding tournament request from the Richfield Soccer Club

Richfield Area Soccer Club President Mike Anderson briefly spoke about the KMSL tournament. President Anderson stated that the tournament draws over a 100 teams from around the area and brings thousands of people to Richfield's Heritage Park. President Anderson thanked the Public Works Department for their great work on prepping the fields for their annual tournament.

Motion by Commissioner Schmitt to approve the date of June 4th, 2016 as the official date for the KMSL Soccer Tournament in Heritage Park; Seconded by Commissioner Meeks; Motion passed without objection.

c. Discussion regarding the Athletic Field Use Reservation Policy and 2016 scheduling

Administrative Services Coordinator KateLynn Schmitt gave an update on how the new scheduling policy has been going. Ms. Schmitt stated both organizations submitted tournament dates and that early on there was a conflict that had been solved. Ms. Schmitt stated that the next important date would be April 1st when both organizations have to submit their dates for regular season games and practices.

Ms. Schmitt also noted that the Rockets organization moved its scrimmage tournament from May 7th and 8th, 2016 to April 30th and May 1st, 2016 in Fireman's Park.

Business Operations Manager for the Richfield Rockets Dave Dietrich spoke about where the Rockets organization is in their scheduling process. Mr. Dietrich also stated that the Rockets have had many of the same questions that RYSBA has, but Staff has been working cooperatively with both organizations to answer those questions in a timely manner.

d. Discussion regarding the Staff Park Operations Report

Administrative Services Coordinator Schmitt gave a brief overview about Park winter operations.

Motion by Commissioner Filipiak to adjourn; Seconded by Commissioner Meeks; Motion passed without objection at 6:37 p.m.

POLICY QUESTION: DOES THE PARK COMMISSION WISH TO APPROVE THE INSTALLATION OF NEW BATTING CAGES IN FIREMAN'S PARK?

ISSUE SUMMARY:

Village Staff was approached by Rockets Business Operations Manager Dave Dietrich regarding the potential installation of new batting cages in Fireman's Park. At the October 14th Park Commission Meeting the Park Commission voted to approve the Athletic Baseball and Softball Field Reservation Policy. The policy gives a certain priority in scheduling to the Rockets organization in Fireman's Park. This request is stemming from the Rockets organization now taking on a greater role in Fireman's Park as more of the summer home field for their organization.


Mr. Dietrich has provided Staff with details regarding the installation of the batting cages. The batting cages are proposed to be located alongside the northernmost edge of the tennis courts currently located in Fireman's Park. The cage itself would take up an area of 17' x 74'. Product features of the cage are located on page two (2) of your attachments and would include some of the following features:

- Rugged #21 polyester mesh netting that is weather and UV resistant
- Backyard cage kit w/ net comes in 40' and 70' lengths
- Following additional 10' x 1 3/8" fence top rail tubes required (available at any home improvement store)
- 70' model- 38 pieces
- Easy cage entry with 24" Overlap Access
- One (1) year limited warranty

DPW Supervisor Schmitt has no objection to the proposed location or installation of the batting cages. As stated on the project description Staff asked that an alternative to grass be installed inside the batting cages in order to provide for an easier level of maintenance for our Park crews. DPW Supervisor Schmitt asked that the material inside the cage be one in which weeds would not be able to penetrate. As wood chips often have issues related to weeds, Staff is asking that this surface option not be used for this project. The surface inside the batting cages currently in Heritage Park have a stone material with artificial grass over the top. This type of alternative surface has been and would continue to be sufficient. If the Rockets organization was not of a mind to install an alternative to grass the Village would still recommend approval of the project and would instead request that the Rocket's organization agree to maintain the area inside the batting cages throughout its use.

Additionally, since this is not a Village of Richfield project, Staff is asking that the project's approval be contingent upon the Rockets organization providing all necessary funding for both the batting cage and the possible alternative surface changes inside the cage. Park Staff will continue to mow and maintain the grounds of Fireman's Park throughout the youth ball season.

The Rockets would like to request permission to place a temporary batting cage on the grounds of Firemen's Park. We would like to place this 17' x 74' cage alongside the tennis court as shown in the diagram below. This cage would be placed on the grounds in April of each year once the Parks Department opens the fields for play. The cage would be removed in October and put into storage for winter to preserve its longevity. See the attached info sheet for more information about the cage.

The Rockets have asked several questions of the Village as it pertains to the surface inside the cage. The Village as stated it would like an alternative to grass such as, artificial turf, Wood Chips, gravel, black top, etc. The unit will have the ability to be moved for ease of grounds maintenance and the Rockets are willing to coordinate with the Village to move it when grounds maintenance is scheduled. The Rockets will be satisfied with whatever is most cost effective for the Village to install and maintain.

POLICY QUESTION: DOES THE PARK COMMISSION WISH TO APPROVE THE REALLOCATION OF CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUNDS TO BE DESIGNATED FOR MAJOR AND MINOR SITE ALTERATIONS AT BARK LAKE PARK?

ISSUE SUMMARY:

At the January Park Commission meeting, the Park Commission asked for alternative considerations for the \$12,500 currently designated for a new stand-alone playground feature in Heritage Park. After reviewing the Bark Lake Park Master Plan and exploring options for the designated funds in conjunction with DPW Supervisor Adam Schmitt, it was decided that most of the clearing/grubbing and common excavation for the trail loop is something that the DPW crews could complete in house. While signs for the trail and aggregate may have some fiscal impact, it is likely that the majority of the project will be completed by our DPW Staff which could save approximately \$4,000 - \$5,000. This means there will be an additional \$7,000 - \$9,000 remaining to invest elsewhere in Bark Lake Park.

Staff is also in the process obtaining wetland delineations from SEWRPC for Bark Lake Park. These delineations are done at no cost to the Village and will provide us with additional information regarding the wetlands in the wooded portion of Bark Lake Park. This will help us determine if the formal trail design is feasible.

One of the other, more immediate, needs that was noted in several of the meetings during the Park Master Planning process was the use of the park for parties and small community gatherings. Because of this need, Staff believes that a concrete slab picnic area accompanied by grills should be installed as well. If the Park Commission chooses to install a 720 square foot Picnic Area – 5” concrete & CABC this would account for an additional \$4,320. This would still allow the Park Commission to be able to allocate between \$2,680 and \$4,680 of funding for additional amenities. It is Staff’s hope that the addition of a few small amenities will better serve the park and the residents who frequent it.

Some of the options for additional amenities are:


Hey Adam,


Park Master Plan Proposed Concept Map

General Park Operations Report for March 2015

Park Commission Members,

As a part of my position as Administrative Services Coordinator, I want to make sure that I have a bi-monthly dialogue with everyone on the Park Commission about General Park Operations. It is important to me that I solicit feedback from this Commission in order to gain not only a greater personal/professional relationship with each and every one of you, but also attempt to cultivate ideas or suggestions you have on ways we can improve our wonderful network of parks throughout the Village. **The knowledge you each have of our park system is an invaluable resource that I intend on tapping into.**

- ✓ **Heritage Park Trails.** During winter snowshoers and cross country skiers are a common sight on our park trail systems. Those trails will be maintained again for the 2016 winter season when time is permitted to clean them up after all Village roads have been cleared. With spring fast approaching, our DPW full-time and part-time crew members will move back into the parks ensuring the trails, fields and open space are restored to their pre-winter condition.
- ✓ **Blacksmith Shop Update.** The Historical Society continues to construct the timber frame of the Blacksmith Shop. Staff was informed recently that a few of the RHS members met with a local farmer looking to take down his barn. Some of the beams in the barn measure 55' long and were made without the use of power tools or handsaws. The hope is to utilize these beams in the shop.
- ✓ **Richfield Historical Park.** The Richfield Historical Society has been collecting sap at their sugar shack for their annual Maple Syrup Family Day. This year the event will take place on March 26th between 1:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. As always, everyone is encouraged to join in for the festivities!
- ✓ **Spring Baseball Scheduling Update.** Richfield youth programs anxiously await warmer weather. The Richfield Youth Softball and Baseball Association and Rockets are actively preparing for the upcoming season. Some additional questions about early field use due to the uncommonly warm weather have come up. Staff has responded with a willingness to coordinate preliminary practices before the April 1st deadline so teams may be able to begin playing as soon as the fields allow it.
- ✓ **New Richfield Volunteer Fire Company Station.** The Richfield Volunteer Fire Company has been in the planning process for their new fire station for several months. At the February 24th, 2016 Architectural Review Board meeting the building design for the new station was approved. The building plans will next go before the Plan Commission on April 7th, 2016 and then the Village Board on April 21st, 2016. Tonight we have the designs available for your review. It is the intention of Staff to move forward with Heritage Park Master Planning once the final project has been formally approved.
